**Random Check of Ballots**

Per RCW 29A.60.170(4) a random audit of batches is required. On February 12, 2019 the political party observer coordinators requested the required audit of ballots be conducted for the Bethel School District, Proposition No. 1. Our system uses up to five digital scanners and one central count server. A random batch from each scanner used in the election (three in this case) was drawn, hand tallied, and compared to the machine report. All results of the hand tally for the chosen race matched the machine report.
